

THE SHIP'S BADGE

BLAZON-Azure, an ancient Greek amphora garnished around the base of the neck with maple leaves, and on the main body of the vessel, a foul anchor erect all of gold.

SIGNIFICANCE-This badge depicts an anceint Greek amphora, an earthenware vessel used as a storage container and from which the stored items were dispensed into smaller vessels as required.

The amphora suggests the ship's function of storing and dispensing supplies; the superimposed maple leaves and foul anchor indicate the Ship belongs to the Royal Canadian Navy.

The golden colour of the amphora is representative of the yellowish colour of oil, a major item of the PROVIDER'S replenishment stores and the dark blue background is generally known as "Navy Blue".

HMCS PROVIDER POST-REFIT RE-ACTIVATION

HMCS PROVIDER has just completed a thorough refit by the Burrard Yarrows Corporation and today's ceremony morks her return to the Fleet. This programme includes information about the ceremony and the ship and lists the andividuals involved.

In future weeks the ship will do trials to ensure that all of her systems are ready for operational service. She will then do work up training to prepare her ship's company to work as a team, and HMCS PROVIDER will then be ready in all respects to support the Fleet and allied Navies.

THE 1982 REFIT

HMCS PROVIDER started her latest refit on 1 Dec 81. Planning has begun much earlier in the ship, NDHQ in Ottawa, Maritime Forces Headquarters in Halifax and Maritime Forces Pacific Headquarters in Esquimalt. The refit has involved a painstaking and thorough overhaul by the Burrard Yarrows Esquimalt Yard of this 19 year old ship and her systems, plus improvements in several areas:

- new radars for navigation and close-range helicopter flight control.
- new Flight Control and Firefighter Control (FLYCO) booth over the Flight deck.
- retubing of both boilers.
- installation of two new 500 KW Diesel generators
- replacing replenishment winches at one of the six stations which now brings all PROVIDER stations up to current Canadian Fleet standards.
- helicopter fuel system improvement.
- Flight deck and hangar firefighting improvements.
- new accommodation for aircrew and helicopter maintainers.

Design of these changes and specifications for the refit was a co-operative project by NDHQ Engineering Staffs, the Naval Engineering Unit (Pacific) in HMC Dockyard Esquimalt, and the Defence and Civil Institute of Environmental Medicine (DCIEM) in Toronto. The project was directed by the Director Maritime Engineering and Maintenance in NDHQ day by day supervision of the work for DND was done by the 404 Technical Services Detachment. Constructural matters were handled by the department of Supply and Services (DSS) and logistics support was joined by the Director Procurement and Supply Maritime in NDHQ working closely with Base Supply, CFB Esquimalt.

During this 9 month refit the ship's company has been busy doing training afloat and ashore in a number of ships and establishments. Some have been employed with the Technical Services Detachment, helping to oversee the refit. Many have joined since the refit started. The ship's company includes representatives from every province and the NWT. Today they have all been brought back together to man their ship.

THE HERITAGE

HMCS PROVIDER was commissioned on 28 September 1963 as a Fleet Replenishment Ship. At the time she was the largest ship yet built for the Canadian Navy in Canada. Constructed by Davie Shipbuilding in Lauzon, Quebec, she was designed for "replenishment of Canadian and allied warships with fuel, ammunition, provisions, (dry and refrigerated) and helicopters. Over the past 19 years HMCS PROVIDER has pioneered new concepts of fleet support in exercises and deployments in the Pacific and Atlantic oceans and has enabled warships of several navies to achieve their operational tasks.

PROVIDER carries on the name of an earlier support ship built in Sorrel, Quebec and commissioned forty years ago in December. She was a support ship to anti-submanine Patrol Boats in the Western Atlantic and was in commission until 1946

Some particulars of HMCS PROVIDER: Length overall 169.2M(555'), Beam 23.2M(76') Max Draught 9.8M (32'), Max Displacement 25,000 tons.

BURRARD YARROWS CORPORATION

Burrard Yarrows Corporation, Victoria Division, strategically located in Esquimalt Harbour and close neighbours physically and in spirit, to CFB Esquimalt has been closely associated with the Royal Navy, Royal Canadian Navy, and Maritime Forces Pacific since 1894.

The Victoria Division repaired and re-fitted many RN ships prior to the formation of the RCN in May, 1910, and in the 1914-1918 war continued this close association.

During the Second World War, this division delivered 17 frigates, 5 minesweepers and 3LSM. Since 1946, the yard has converted the destroyers SIOUX and ALGONQUIN, refitted and repaired many other RCN ships and built HMCS FRASER and SASKATCHEWAN under its naval construction program. This division has refitted HMCS PROVIDER on two previous occassions and most recently completed the refit, docking and alteration of HMCS MACKENZIE.

In addition to the Naval units mentioned, this division has constructed and delivered in excess of 350 commercial marine vessels of a diversitified nature.
