"DECLARATION OF OUR HOPES FOR FUTURE"

WHEN I spoke to you last, at Christmas, I asked you all, whatever your religion, to pray for me on the day of my Coronation—to pray that God would give me wisdom and strength to carry out the promises that I should then be making.

Throughout this memorable day I have been uplifted and sustained by the knowledge that your thoughts and prayers were with me. I have been aware all the time that my peoples, spread far and wide throughout every Continent and ocean in the world, were united to support me in the task to which I have now been dedicated with such solemnity.

Many thousands of you came to London from all parts of the Commonwealth and Empire to join in the ceremony, but I have been conscious too of the millions of others who have shared in it by means of wireless or television in their homes.

All of you, near or far, have been united in one purpose. It is hard for me to find words in which to tell you of the strength which this knowledge has given me. The ceremonies you have seen to-day are ancient, and some of their origins are veiled in the mists of the past. But their spirit and their meaning shine through the ages never, perhaps, more brightly than now.

I have in sincerity pledged myself to your service, as so many of you are pledged to mine. Throughout all my life and with all my heart I shall strive to be worthy of your trust.

In this resolve I have my husband to support me. He shares all my ideals and all my affection for you. Then, although my experience is so short and my task so new I have in my parents and grandparents an example which I can follow with certainty and with confidence.

There is also this. I have behind me not only the splendid traditions and the annals of more than a thousand years, but the living strength and majesty of the Commonwealth and Empire, of societies old and new, of lands and races different in history and origins but all, by God's will, united in spirit and in aim.

Therefore I am sure that this, my Coronation, is not the symbol of a power and a splendour that are gone, but a declaration of our hopes for the future, and for the years I may, by God's grace and mercy, be given to reign and serve you as your Queen.

I have been speaking of the vast regions and varied peoples to whom I owe my duty, but there has also sprung from our island home a theme of social and political thought which constitutes our message to the world and through the changing generations has found acceptance both within and far beyond my realms.

Parliamentary institutions, with their free speech and respect for the rights of minorities, and the inspiration of a broad tolerance in thought and its expression—all this we conceive to be a precious part of our way of life and outlook.

During recent centuries, this message has been sustained and invigorated by the immense contribution in language, literature and action, of the nations of our Commonwealth overseas. It gives expression, as I pray it always will, to living principles as sacred to the Crown and monarchy as to its many Parliaments and peoples.

I ask you now to cherish them—and practise them too. Then we can go forward together in peace, seeking justice and freedom for all men.

As this day draws to its close, I know that my abiding memory of it will be, not only the solemnity and beauty of the ceremony, but the inspiration of your loyalty and affection. I thank you all from a full heart. God bless you all.

## THE OATH


*Archbishop* : Madam, is your Majesty willing to take the Oath ?

Onward toward her sacring.


'Mid the rich lights of June, one gleam I see,

Serving His greater purpose.





"TEN years ago, the streets of any town in the United Kingdom gave a striking demonstration of the unity of the Commonwealth and Empire. Troops from all corners of the earth proudly bore the flashes of their countries on the shoulders of their uniforms. When war is on our hands there is no doubt of the close co-operation and mutual affection of our family of nations. It is there for all to see.

Once the battle is won we are inclined once more to go our separate ways and get immersed in our local problems of economic survival. It might even be thought that the old feeling born of common danger had died down. Nothing could be further from the truth, a fact which often causes surprise and sometimes consternation to other nations.

This year it was a very much happier family gathering than ten years ago ; for we were all bidden to participate in the greatest ceremony in our history, the crowning of a new monarch. A new and glorious reign has been inaugurated. Our young Queen, described so aptly as God's gift to the Empire, has ascended the throne to reign over us all for what we hope will be a new Elizabethan era.

All of you who witnessed the scene will, I know, never forget the part you played in it ; a memory which will remain with you for the rest of your lives. It is in this spirit that this souvenir book is offered to you.


The Coronation emphasised in no uncertain manner the strong current of goodwill existing between all members of the Commonwealth and Empire. But, what I am concerned about here is the feeling of affectionate gratitude in this country for all that you men and women from overseas did during the testing years of the war.

The War Office, Commonwealth Relations Office, the Colonial Office and the three Service Departments asked the British Empire Service League to undertake the entertainment of the overseas Coronation Contingents while in this country, a task which naturally we were only too proud to undertake. Generous funds were provided, in fact, there was more than enough money available for everything that was possible to arrange for the troops without interfering with their training programme and their Coronation duties.


In making these arrangements, as you will see from this souvenir, we worked in constant contact with all the services, British Railways, London Transport, Aldershot and District and various municipalities. We received from them the most willing assistance. Nothing was too much trouble when they knew its purpose. At no time did they hesitate to put themselves out, often at short notice, to do what normally might have been considered impossible.

Finally, we had the organisations, the firms, the farms and the private individuals who spared neither time nor expense and who entered into the work we were doing with real enthusiasm. We know from the letters we have received from so many of you that this goodwill on the part of the Mother Country left a lasting impression on your memories.
























A programme was drawn up with a view to providing items of special interest which would conflict as little as possible with training schedules.

The measure of success achieved may be drawn from the letters of appreciation received that appear elsewhere in this report.



I am writing on behalf of the women in the Canadian Coronation Contingent to try to say thank you for the entertainment programme and organization provided for Overseas Troops by the B.E.S.L.

We have worn out the word "wonderful" and have completely run out of adjectives to describe our many thrilling experiences, but perhaps above all we have been impressed by the welcome and kindness shown to us by the British people, from the Royal Family on through all groups with whom we came in contact. However, we are fully aware that most of these contacts and experiences would not have been possible without the thoughtfulness, generosity and hard work of your Committee and the B.E.S.L. in planning, co-ordinating, arranging transport and so on.

We were disappointed that we could not take advantage of some of the tours and visits which were offered, because we had to concentrate at first on getting into training for the Coronation Parade.

We tried to make it clear which items in the programme we would not be able to attend, but we were rather concerned because we could not make sure that our messages had reached those responsible for arrangements. We can only hope that the kind people doing the planning were not put to any inconvenience. With so many small contingents it must have been very difficult to keep track of all their programmes.

The arrangements for transport were very helpful to us. During the day a good deal of time can be wasted getting to and from the Richmond Park Camp, but in the evenings, buses, etc., stop running, and there are many things which it would have been quite impossible for the women to attend without your help.
