#### SECTION VI - ENGINE-ROOM.

#### Report on Ship's Efficiency in the Engine-Room Department:-

All machinery spaces and compartments in charge of the Engineer Officer were inspected while the ship was at St. Margaret Bay, N.S.

The Watch and Quarter Bill had to be entirely changed in order to provide a workable routine for all stations.

The Tiller Flat was badly stowed and the First Lieutenant was advised to secure upper deck gear in this compartment. The Steering Engine performs satisfactorily.

- The Gland Compartment bilges were very dirty with excess oil and the E.O. had taken steps to clean them. The Glands are satisfactory.
- The Engine "oom is in fair shape but more attention could be given to routine cleaning. Main and auxiliary machinery is stated to run well. Watchkeepers were told to carry flashlights.

The Boiler Rooms are fairly good and the bilges are oil free. Sone feed-pump in No. 1 oiler Room is defective. The E.O. was advised to keep the sand boxes clear of gear.

Spare gear was in good shape when it left the ship but signs of rust are appearing and will require attention.

- \* Fire equipment is not sufficient but demands are in for more extinguishers and sand. Some of the equipment was repositioned.
- \* Damage Control had received little attention and the E.O. was advised to hold practices until efficiency is attained.

Secondary lighting is adequate in the department although some batteries require charging.

All books were sighted except the "Examination of Accessible Compartments" which the E.O. stated could not be obtained. He was advised to start an "E.O.'s Acquaintance Book".

Lieut. (E) E.B. Kelly, RCNR, is in charge of machinery; he is undoubtedly a good engineer but could pay more attention to Service routine such as Watch and Quarter Bills, Action Stations, etc. Sub-Lieut. (E) H.U. Ross is borne for training. The senior ERA is H.J. Kyle, C/E.R.A., A-3056; he is considered to be very good by the E.O. The Chief Stoker is E.A. Parsone Ch. Sto. O.N. 21310; he is not considered satisfactory by the E.O.

General impression of Engine Room Department: Machinery -- good; organization and routine -- fair.\*

Messdecks are fairly crowded, but well ventilated, clean and tidy. Bathroom and Heads facilities are adequate. These are kept clean, sanitary and in excellent working order.

#### 4. Galley and Refrigerator.

Galley and Refrigerator are very satisfactory.

Normally pleasant and quiet, but strikes hard and without hesitation at any evidence of slackness and inefficiency in his officers and crew. Commands their respect and liking. - (\*) <u>Navigating Officer: Lieutenant L.D.G. MAIN, RCNVR</u>. Appeared to be above average in his ability and interested in navigation Jovial personality. Evinced a genuine and active interest in the progress of his Radar department. Would make a good First Lieutenant.
- (e) <u>Gunnery Officer: Sub/Lieutenant E.A. Grant, RCNVR</u>. A former Leading Seaman, Q.R.II, who with a bit more seasoning as an Officer will be outstanding. Confident and able.
- (f) Signals and C.B. Officer: Sub/Lieutenant MITCHELL, RCNVR. Joined ship during last week of W.U.P.'s. Has had Divisional experience Taking hold of his responsibilities earnestly.
- (g) Engineer Officer: Lieutenant (E) E.B. KELLY, RCNR. Is in charge of machinery; he is undoubtedly a good Engineer but could pay more attention to Service routine such as Watch and Quarter Bills, Action Stations, etc.
- (h) Engineer Officer: Sub/Lieut.(E) H.V. ROSS, RCNVR (Add'l) Displayed little energy or initiative during WUP's.
  - (1) <u>Medical Officer: Surgeon Lieutenant J.W. ROGERS, RCNVR</u>. A definite asset to this ship. Apart from his medical organization, he was frequently involved in gunnery and seamanship exercises. Took a very active interest in WUP's.

#### SECTION X - FINAL ASSESSMENT OF TRAINING COMMANDER.

#### Fighting Efficiency:

Reached a satisfactory standard during the W.U.P. but can become above average, particularly in gunnery, if frequent practice is obtained. The improvement shown, from one practical exercise to the next effort in asdic and gunnery, was quite marked. If the present keenness of officers and crew is maintained, efficiency in all departments will be achieved.

#### Appearance:

Generally good. A good cleaning and maintenance routine is in effect, and if strictly adhered to, will assure a good standard of cleanliness. There were one or two quite astonishing though isolated pieces of gross untidiness on inspection day which must be eradicated lest they prove contagious.

#### General Impression:

Two factors are hampering rapid development of all-round efficiency in this ship. Firstly, there is an unusually low calibre of seamen leading rates. Both coxswain and Chief Boatswain's Mate have little, or no, power of command. With the possible exception of one Leading Seaman of a watch, no worthwhile leadership can be developed in this quarter. The acquisition of one or two good Leading Seamen would supply some backbone where it is most needed.

Secondly, though the E.O. can unquestionably be trusted to maintain the efficiency of engines and boilers, he takes no great interest in such matters as Fire and Repair Organization. An energetic Engineer Sub.Lieutenant would assist in adding some vitality to the department.

The ship is basically well officered, well organized and well equipped. If the Captain can transmit enough of his own spirit to his officers and crew she will make an excellent fighting unit.


