HMCS GEORGIAN - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR THE MONTHS OF FEBRUARY TO DECEMBER, 1944

HMS "Baffin"</i> developed Asdic defects was ordered to return to harbour. Convoy formed up at 0800x/27 escorts assuming positions as follows: <i>HMCS Georgian</i> , "A" for able, <i>HMCS Kentville</i> , "E" for Easy, <i>HMCS Medicine Hat</i> , "P" for Peter. Canso aircraft commenced patrol at 0830z/27. <i>SS Ashbury Park</i> escorted by <i>HMCS French</i> joined convoy at 2245x/27 from Mulgrave. The weather and sea deteriorated throughout the following night, visibility becoming so poor that convoy began to break up. Weather continuing to
		deteriorate, <i>HMCS Georgian</i> suggested to Commodore that it would be advisable to heave to until weather conditions improved. At 0820x/28 Commodore ordered convoy to heave to, the convoy being by now widely dispersed.

		At 0930z/28 remainder of convoy proceeded at slow speed. Halifax Light Vessel #6 was sighted at 0820z/29 and it was ascertained that five stragglers from the convoy had already entered harbour. HMCS Medicine Hat was ordered to proceed into harbour escorting two stragglers as she had developed asdic defects whilst remaining escorts continued rounding up stragglers. At 1630z/29 SS Ashbury Park was reported in distress. Ordered to investigate, HMCS Georgian carried out an extensive search in Halifax approaches without result. At 0940z/30 HMCS Georgian was ordered to discontinue search. At 1215z/30 passed gates and proceeded to berth at French Cable Wharf."
