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#### DECLARATION TO BE MADE BY APPLICANT (B)

I hereby declare as follows:-

- (1) That I am a British Subject domiciled in Canada.
- (2) That I am desirous of being enrolled as a member of the Royal Canadian Naval Reserve, and that I accept and agree to abide by the rules of the said Force.
  - (3) (a) That it is my intention to follow the sea for a period of at least five years from this date.
    - (b) That it is my intention to follow the calling of a Fireman, other at sea or on she of five years from this date.
    - Fersonnel trevers (c) That it is my intention to follow the sea in an Engine room capacity from this date.

Note.—Candidates for enrolment as Seaman are to cross out clauses (b) and (4) above. Candidates for enrolment as Stoker are to cross out clauses (a) and (c) above. - (6) That the particulars contained above are correct and true according to the best of my knowledge and belief.
- (7) On being enrolled as a member of the Royal Canadian Naval Reserve, I undertake and bind myself:-
  - (a) To serve from the date thereof for five consecutive years, being subject to the provisions of the Naval Service Act, and of the Regulations made in pursuance thereof for the government of the Royal Canadian Naval Reserve, and to the customs and usages of His Majesty's Canadian Naval Service.
  - (b) To report for active service if called upon in time of war or emergency, and, if called into active service, to serve ashore or affoat as may be directed according to where my services are required.
  - (c) To keep in good repair and condition the articles of uniform and any articles of outfit which may be issued to me and to return them to the nearest Registrar or to Training Headquarters prior to my discharge or when required so to do by any authorized person, or to pay compensation for any loss or damage thereto other than fair wear and tear; and also not to wear such uniform or outfit (which is and remains the property of the Crown) except when on Naval duty.

(8) I am willing to be vaccinated or re-vaccinated and inoculated as considered necessary by the appropriate authorities.

"SPIKENARD", was torpedoed and sunk by enemy action at sea.

Dear Madam:

It is with deepest regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 18th February 1942 from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services informing you that your son, Alfred Smedley Kettle, Chief Petty Officer, R.C.N.R., O.N. A.2382, is missing and must be presumed lost on Active Service.

Your son was serving in H.M.C.S.
"SPIKENARD" which was torpedoed and sunk by enemy action on the 10th February 1942. Details of the action are not, however, available at this time.

The possibility of your son having been rescued by other ships cannot be estimated but it has been established that he was not among the survivors landed at a United Kingdom port and very little hope is held out for the survival of the remainder. You will be informed immediately should any further information be received.

I wish to express the sincere sympathy of the Chief of the Naval Staff, Officers and men of the Royal Canadian Navy the high traditions of which your son has helped to maintain.
