

"GALT" SUBMITTED: The following is a report of finding the body of the above named rating in New York Bay, at Pier 10, U.S. Naval Frontier Base, Tompkinsville, Staten Island, N. Y. at approximately 1930Z on 25th. April, 1945, obtaining the services of the funeral director, and arranging to have the remains shipped to Canada; all of which was done in accordance with Canadian Naval Regulations, Article 384, Amendment #309, Para. 9(A). On finding the body this base summoned the N.Y.C. Police (Precinct 120). The body was dressed in No. 2's, with burberry, no cap, and in an advanced state of decomposition. Preliminary identification was indicated by the name G.R.EASTMAN stencilled of the inside of the collar. There was no Identification Card or official identity disc on the body. Police searched the body which was viewed by A/Lt.Cdr.F.J.D.Pemberton, RCNVR (Canadian Naval Liaison Officer, Staten Island, N.Y.), Warrant Officer (SB) R.L.Green, RCNVR, and P.J.McGurk, A/R.A. 4cl. V-22335. They found the following articles which were handed over to Miss Inez Morgan, who accompanied the remains to Canada, by Lt.Cdr.Pemberton: Personal Effects: 1 leather covered Address Book, in which was found addresses of other members of the Eastman family and friends in Nipawin, Sask.

Two warrants were obtained from the British Naval Liaison Office, New York, one single fare for the remains to Mipawin, Sask. and the other a round trip Pullman for Miss Morgan to Nipawin. Lt. Cdr. Pemberton met Miss Morgan, and Mr. Saunders, the Canadian Pacific representative at Grand Central Station before the train left to check that everything was in order.

Dear Mr. Eastman,

Please accept the sincere sympathy of the Officer the crew and myself in the sad loss of your son, Garnet.

Due to circumstances beyond my control, your letter of April,16th only just reached me when I was officially advised of the finding of his body, and this is my first opportunity to write.

Your son had an excellent record aboard this ship, always dependable and most popular with his mess mates. For some time we have all felt that some such misfortune must have befallen him, but the ship sailed, and as he had not returned on board, we had to list him as an absentee. As you know, in the Navy, an absentee after seven days becomes a deserter.

A number of the ship's company made enquires from mutal friends ashore, and I kept checking for information with the authorities ashore both in that port and in Halifax, all to no avail.

The weather was especially had on the January trip, and I remember there was a lost of snow on the docks the night Garnet disappeared. I can only presume that he must have slipped from the dock and possibly struck his head on a fender log, or the fast running current carried him out of hailing distance. The size of the port, together with the many attractions ashore are themselves enough to abate any suspicions of accident that might be aroused when even the best men are absent over leave.

Garnet had been aboard this ship for two years, and during that time his character was exemplary.

Believe me, we all share in your loss.

Dear Mrs. Eastman:

It is with deepest regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 27th of April, 1945, from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, informing you of the death of your son, Garnet Russell Eastman, Telegraphist, Official Number V-11766, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, due to drowning in New York, New York, U.S.A.

According to the report received, your son was reported as an absentee from his ship on the 13th of January, 1945, when the Canadian Naval Authorities instigated a search to ascertain his whereabouts. As he was not located within a week the Civil authorities were informed and a more extensive search conducted. During this period however, there was no reason to believe that Telegraphist Eastman was other than alive.

There was no news of his whereabouts until his body was recovered from a harbour pier at Staten Island, New York, on the 25th of April, 1945. A positive identification was made at that time.

No other particulars have as yet been received but when any news is available regarding the manner of his death it will be passed on to you immediately.

In accordance with your wishes, your son's body is being sent, at public expense, to Nipawin, Saskatchewan. You will be informed of the date and time of arrival.

Please allow me to express sincere sympathy suith you in your bereavement on behalf of the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, the Chief of the Naval Staff, and the Officers and men of the Royal Canadian Navy.
