I just returned from your brother's ship and the Captain and crew asked me if I would drop you a line and tell you that they fulfilled the old ancient Navy custom of raffling the kit of a deceased member of the crew. He must have been a very popular boy on the ship because they are now sending you over a hundred pounds. Truly Miss Davies he was very well liked by everyone, officers and men alike. He was a good boy too. You can be very proud of him. They are also sending his uniform and I arranged that his wrist watch should be sent to you from Halifax. I have a snapshot and the official notice of the location of the grave which I will send later on.

Dear Miss Davies:

By this time, I am sure you have been informed of the loss of your brother. As commanding officer of the ship in which he served, it now becomes my privileged duty to enlarge somewhat upon that "Formal Notification" and to ease your heart and mind if I can, of any unnecessarily heavy grief.

If it would help you to know how your brother died, I can tell you that he and his chum were cleaning the ship's revolvers in the normal course of their duty and they have done this job since they joined the ship. While cleaning one of the guns, it went off accidentally and your brother was shot in the chest and was dead in ten minutes. One of my officers read the last rites to him before he died. In spite of a full investigation on board, it has been impossible to discover how the gun was fired.

A full Naval funeral was held and on his grave there is a wreath from his Camrose ship-mates. I have arranged to have photographs of the grave taken and will send you prints.

And now before I close, I would like to tell you just how and what we all though of your brother "Bill" Davies. I suppose he was to you at home what he was to us; a cheerful, popular, industrious lad and at all times a credit to his ship and his country. Officers and men alike respected his ability and his loss will be felt by us all for many months.

I am happy to have had this opportunity of writing you on behalf of the Ship's Company. You have our deepest sympathy and if I can be of any further assistance I shall be only too glad to be at your service.

Dear Miss Davies:

Further to my letter of the 23rd of June, 1944, I am passing on for your information particulars which have been received in a very brief report from overseas.

According to the information given, your brother was buried in the Royal Naval Cemetery, Clayhall, Portsmouth, England, at 2.30 o'clock in the afternoon of the 27th of June, 1944.

It is understood that your brother's grave is being cared for and will be temporarily marked with a specially designed wooden cross bearing his official particulars. While the Imperial War Graves Commission is the authority for permanently marking by the use of a uniform headstone, the graves of His Majesty's forces who die on active service, it is understood that due to war conditions these headstones cannot be erected at the present time.

May I again express the sincere sympathy of the Department in your bereavement.

RE: Accidental Death by Shooting of William John Davies A.B. AA II, V-33689.

At approximately 1045, 21 June '44, A.B. Corth QR III, on instructions from A.B. Davies reported to 0.0.D. for keys to revolver cabinet in Wardroom to collect guns for cleaning, which job had been allotted these men for the last seven months.

Six revolvers were taken to gunners stores where the cleaning process was begun by the two above-named ratings. At 1055 0.0.D. came rushing to me on the bridge to report that A.B. Davies had been accidentally shot through the chest. I immediately signalled Capt. Dl for ambulance, and H.M.S. "Emerald", nearest ship in harbour with M.O., requesting assistance. H.M.S. "Emerald" replied she had no boat available and requested I send my own boat. Ship's whaler was sent immediately, having no power boat. But before whaler had arrived at H.M.S. "Emerald", Davies had passed away.

A signal to this effect was sent to Capt. Dl, and to H.M.S.

"Emerald". Therefore M.O. from "Emerald was not required.

Shor e ambulance with M.O. arrived at approximately 1320 and the body was examined. It was being prepared to be taken ashore when Canadian base Padre Pike arrived with orders from Capt. Dl and Canadian Liasen Officer to have body removed with all personal belongings. This was done and the First Lieutenant with two witnesses were landed with the body and met by the Coroners Officer.

Full report of inquest will follow.
