Dear Sir:

I deeply regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 16th October from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services informing you of the loss of your daughter, Nursing Sister Agnes Wightman Wilkie, R.C.M.

as stated in my second telegram of the 16th October, the remains of your daughter have been washed ashore in Newfoundland, and the Flag Officer Newfoundland Force has arranged for the funeral with full Naval honours. I have further instructed the Flag Officer Newfoundland Force to forward to you by air mail full information regarding the arrangements made for the funeral of your daughter.

I deeply regret that under a recent wartime regulation it was not possible to comply with your request of the 17th October to have your daughter's body returned to her home for interment. In this connection, the following is an extract from the regulations "During hostilities, bodies of personnel of The Canadian Naval Forces who die while serving at points outside Canada or the United States of America will not under any circumstances be returned to Canada or the United States for interment, either at public expense or at the request of relatives". I trust that under these circumstances, the arrangements made by the Flag Officer Newfoundland Force will prove satisfactory.

May I express the sincere sympathy of the Chief of the Naval Staff, Officers, Nursing Sisters and men of the Royal Canadian Navy in your bereavement.

COPY St. John's, Newfoundland, 21st October, 1942. My dear Mr. Wilkie, I am sure there is nothing I can possibly say to assuage the grief felt by yourself, Mrs. Wilkie and other members of your family in the loss of your beloved daughter, Nursing Sister Agnes W. Wilkie, R.C.N. The knowledge that she sacrificed her life for her country and in the cause of freedom may afford you some comfort. Your late daughter's funeral was conducted with full Naval honours and she now rests on the slope of a hill in Mount Pleasant Cemetery, St. John's. The esteem with which she was held by her comrades at the Royal Canadian Naval Hospital, St. John's, and by all others with whom she was associated, was shown by the profusion of flowers that covered the casket. Miss Margaret M. Brooke, R.C.N., your late daughter's companion on the ill-fated voyage attests to the fortitude with which Nursing Sister Wilkie met death. She was not injured and her suffering could not have been of long duration. She slipped away from the raft without a sound. Her body was the first to be recovered and was brought from Port aux Basques to St. John's yesterday, escorted by a Naval Officer from her native Province. Enclosed you will find an account of the funeral services, together with a set of pictures which describe scenes during the funeral. These, perhaps, will in some measure alleviate the sorrow that has befallen you in the loss of your daughter. On behalf of the Newfoundland Command of the Royal Canadian Navy, I extend to you and your family our sincere condolences. Yours very sincerely, (SGD.) E. R. St. John's, Nfld., 20th October, 1942.

On a rugged, windblown hillside in Newfoundland, her Naval comrades laid to rest all that was mortal of Agnes W. Wilkie, first Nursing Sister of the Royal Canadian Navy to make the supreme sacrifice in the present war. She lost her life when S.S. "CARIBOU", Newfoundland Ferry Ship was sunk by an enemy submarine in the Cabot Strait early last Wednesday morning.

In the chill of a blustery autumn afternoon, as the day was slowly mellowing into dusk, they bore her Union Jack draped casket down the slope of St. John's Mount Pleasant Cemetery to her last resting place...a spot that is forever Manitoba. Because she was a Manitoba woman and, having dedicated her life to the healing of others, she answered her country's call early and went forth to serve. She was appointed to the Royal Canadian Naval Hospital at St. John's where she became Assistant Matron and, she had just completed her first leave as a Naval Nursing Sister - a visit to her parents in Carman, Manitoba when the hun in his ruthlessness cut her off in the prime of life.

She and her hospital companion, Miss Maragret M. Brooke R.C.N. of Ardath, Saskatchewan, kept together after the torpedo struct They clung determinedly to the same raft for more than two hours and then Nursing Sister Wilkie lost consciousness. Just before dawn, the seas became so rough that Miss Brooke could not hold on to her friendany longer, so Eursing Sister Wilkie floated away to her death.

"She wasn't hurt, neither did she suffer for lo"
liss Brooke, who was rescued when a rating on the rescue shift

The body of Nursing Sister Wilkie was the first to be reclaimed from the sea. The remains were brought to Port aux Basques and thence were sent on to St. John's by train, EscoRTED by a Naval Officer from the late Nursing Sister's native province. The casket arrived in St. John's on Monday afternoon and the funeral, with full Naval honours, took place the same day from Cochrane Street United Church. The service w s conducted by Rev. G. Roy Inglis, Chaplain of the Royal Canadian Navy, assisted by the pastor, Rev. Clifford Knowles.

Commodore M.R. Mainguy, R.C.N., Flag Officer Newfoundland orce paid his respects both at the church service and at the graveside thile the Mursing Sisters from the R.C.N. Mospital, led by Matron E.I. Stibbard, attended in a body, as did the R.C.N. Surgeons, headed by Commander A.L. Anderson, Base Medical Officer. All other Naval establishments were represented as well as medical officers and nurses from all other services including those of the United States.

Colours of the ships in Harbour and of the shore establishmen were at half must and the Firing Party and Naval Escort were lined up outside the Church as six Sick Berth Attendants, who had worked in classociation with the late Nursing Sister, carried the casket along the aisle to the chancel and the assembly sang the hymn:

"O Love that wilt not let me go,
I rest my weary soul in Thee;
I give Thee back the life I owe,
That in Thine ocean depths its flow
May richer, fuller be."

Then followed the reading of the lesson by the chaplain the prayer by Rev. Mr. Knowles.

"O God of all comfort and sustaining grace, be very no we beseech Thee, to her loved ones for distant from here" was invocation offered by the pastor. "Though they must mourn he comfort them with lovely memories and fair hopes. Assure the unfailing Providence and the anowlege that all devoted and he qualities of character are preserved of Thee. May they not she lies in a strange land, for all the earth is Thine and.

own good time, all shall be gathered together".

Following the Benediction the Organist, Arthur News, played the Dead March in Eaul after which the flower laden casket borne to the waiting hearse and the firing party presented arms.

The rain beat down as the cortege wended its way along the cemetery path to the graveside. The Chaplain intoned the burial prayer "ashes to ashes, dust to dust." Three volleys rang out over the grave and, as the last note of the "Last Post" died away in the stillness of the afternoon, Commodore Mainguy stepped to the open grave and brought his right hand up in a final salute. It was then that a shaft of sun breached the slanting rain and threw its ray on the casket.

As the procession filed past the grave, Officers saluted, while the Nursing Sisters paused in farewell tribute.
