Further to my letter of the 23rd of November, 1944, I regret to inform you that in view of the length of time which has elapsed since your son, James Alexander Vair, Leading Steward, Official Number A-4980, Royal Canadian Naval Reserve, was reported missing from H.M.C.S. "ATHABASKAN", and as no news has since been received to the contrary, the Canadian Naval Authorities have now presumed his death to have occurred on the 29th of April, 1944.

May I again express sincere sympathy with you in your bereavement on behalf of the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, the Chief of the Naval Staff, and the Officers and men of the Royal Canadian Navy.

Dear Mrs. Vair:

It is very much regretted that you have not previously received official information of the loss of your son, James Alexander Vair, Leading Steward, Official Number A-4980, Royal Canadian Naval Reserve, but there was no record in the Department of your name and current mailing address as your son had indicated his wife Mrs. Norma E. Vair, St. Joseph's Island, Ont. as next-of-kin.

As you are aware, your son has been listed as missing since H.M.C.S. "ATHABASKAN" was torpedoed and sunk by enemy action on the 29th of April, 1944, in the English Channel. No information has since been received of his survival or that he is a prisoner of war.

Eighty-five men are now known to have been taken prisoners of war from H.M.C.S. "ATHABASKAN". This list was compiled from names officially communicated by the German Government and from capture cards and letters which have been forwarded to the next-of-kin by prisoners of war in German camps. Five of these prisoners of war, one officer and four ratings, were returned to the United Kingdom.

For your information, I am attaching a list of the above.

The body of one rating from this ship has been recovered and buried in France.

Ten officers and one hundred and fifteen ratings are still missing from H.M.C.S. "ATHABASKAN", and I regret to inform you that slight hope is now held for the survival of your son and the others listed as missing.

Should no information be received to the contrary, Leading Steward Vair will be presumed dead by the Canadian Naval Authorities at a later date and you will be informed accordingly.

It is possible this letter should be sent to Wartime Information Board, Ottawa - if so, will you be good enough to pass it on to them.

May I hear from you promptly please with any information you are able to offer in this case?

Mai Inde Routeing Remarks

CANADIANS IN GERMANY The first purely Canadian prisoner of war camp in Germany is near Stettin. It has a population of 1400. The men work mainly in farming detachments in the vicinity. Medical care and dental treatment are described in the report of a neutral observer as excellent. The men have a theatre and orchestra, organized sports and games and a gramophone. Near Bremen are two Naval camps; Marlag for men of the Navy, Milag, for Merchant Seamen and interned civilians. At Marlag are men from the Canadian destroyer Athabaska sunk off Brest at the end of April. To date 129 Canadian Naval and Merchant Seamen are reported in German hands. General conditions at both camps are reported satisfactory. British officers receive food and clothing parcels and distribute them without interference from German authorities. (COPY)
