(a) To serve from the date thereof for three consecutive years, being subject to the provisions of the Naval Service Act, and of the Regulations made in pursuance thereof for the government of the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, and to the customs and usages of His Majesty's Canadian Naval Service.
(b) To report for active service if called upon in time of war or emergency, and, if called into active service, to serve ashore or affoat as may be directed, according to where my services are required.
(c) To keep in good repair and condition the articles of uniform and any articles of outfit which may be issued to me and to return them to the nearest Divisional Commanding Officer or to Training Head quarters prior to my discharge or when required so to do by any authorized person, or to pay compensation for any loss or damage thereto other than fair wear and tear; and also not to wear such uniform or outfit (which is and remains the property of the Crown) except when on naval duty.

WAR SERVICE GRATUITY

Sirs:

#V.8376 - DEARDEN, Arthur N.

The above noted was an ex-rating, Ordinary Seaman, Royal Canadian Naval Service, and was posted on a merchant ship as an anti-aircraft gunner. He lost his life on March 14, 1941. The above noted did not assign any pay but sent \$15.00 per month for four months to his mother, Mrs. Alice Dearden, 90 Edinburgh Ave., Hamilton.

Mrs. Dearden is now applying to you for War Service Gratuity that would otherwise be coming to the naval rating if he were still alive. Her reason for doing so is because her husband, who was maintaining the home at the time of death of the rating, has since then become totally disabled and therefore unable to further maintain the home. They have no minor children; one son married.

Mr. and Mrs. Dearden Sr. have been granted Pension of \$25.00 per month, C.P.C., effective Nov. 1, 1944, on account of V.8376, Arthur N. Dearden.

Would greatly appreciate your advising Mrs. Dearden if War Service Gratuity would be payable in their behalf.
