Dear Madam:

It is with deep regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 18th September, from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services informing you that your husband, Surgeon Lieutenant George Ainslie Hendry, R.C.N.V.R., is missing believed killed in action.

It is in the public interest that the name of his ship and the fact that she has been in action should not find its way to the enemy until such time as it is decided to publish the fact in a Naval Casualty List. It is therefore requested that this news, other than the fact that your husband is missing, may be treated as confidential.

Please allow me to express sincere sympathy with you in your bereavement on behalf of the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, Chief of the Naval Staff, and the Officers and men of the Royal Canadian Navy, the high traditions of which your husband has helped to maintain.

Dear Mrs. Hendry:

Your inquiry respecting the Mention in Despatches awarded your late husband, Surgeon Lieutenant George Ainslie HENDRY, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, has been referred to Naval Service Headquarters by the Commanding Officer, H.M.C.S. "TECUMSEH".

As all honours and awards respecting Canadian Naval personnel are widely publicized in the press throughout Canada, it is not the policy of the department to notify the recipients or their next of kin personally. Surgeon-Lieutenant Hendry's award was published in the Canada Gazette under date of 1st of January, 1943, and appeared in the press on the evening of the 31st of December, 1942. The citation reads as follows:

"Whilst serving in one of His Majesty's Canadian destroyers in the North Atlantic, the late Surgeon Lieutenant G. A. Hendry performed outstanding surgical work aboard his ship, and displayed at all times the most commendable devotion to duty."

The department is proud, as you are, of the splendid manner in which your late husband upheld the finest traditions of the Service, and it is hoped that this knowledge may afford you some measure of consolation in your great loss.
