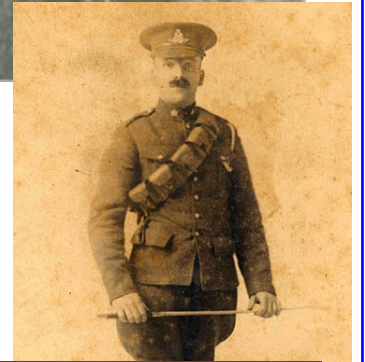
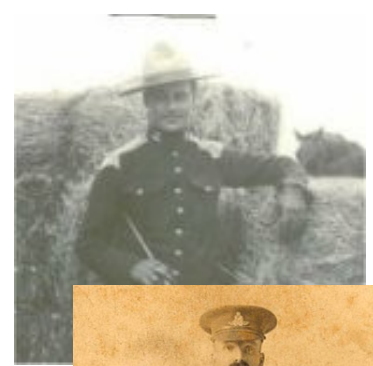

PTE. A. B. LOBB DIES.
Pte. Alexander B. Lobb, who received gunshot wounds on Nov. 22nd, died on December 1st. He was a stretcher bearer and before enlisting was a postman. He was 22 years of age, and has a brother, Mr. T. W. Lobb, who lives at 139 Garden avenue. A sister, Mrs. Nicholls, lives at 25 Wright avenue, and his mother resides on Maple Grove avenue. He was born in Toronto and went to Fern Avenue School. He was a member of two or three branches of the Orange order in the city, and belonged to the Royal Grenadiers before the outbreak of war.



PTE. W. T. HOWARD.
Pte. Walter Thompson Howard is reported to have died in France. The only intimation that he was unwell was a cable received by the family stating that he was dangerously ill. This was followed by the official notice stating that he had succumbed to his illness. He was 24 years old, born in Toronto, and was educated at Parkdale Collegiate. He was employed at the Post-Office before enlisting. He is a son of Mr. Walter Howard, 52 Harvard avenue, and has three other brothers serving, Pte. Roy Howard in hospital in England, and Pte. Albert Howard, and Gunner Percy Howard. Pte. Howard won a medal for his shooting at the Armouries when a school cadet of about 13 years old. He left Canada in December, 1916, and has been on the anti-aircraft guns.



Pte. A. R. Tinsley
Pte. A. R. Tinsley, 138th Batt. (known to all his friends as Reg.) was killed at Vimy Ridge. He formerly worked in the post office, general delivery. His father and two sisters live in Nottingham, England. Two brothers are with the colors, one in France, the other at Salonika, and was at Gallipoli. Arch. Tinsley, the elder brother, enlisted the same time as Reg. Tinsley. He is deeply missed in the post office, as he was an active member of the Post-Office Clerks' association.



PTE. A. KENNEDY MISSING.
Pte. A. Kennedy of 658 (Hindstons) avenue is reported missing on April 8, and his wife and little baby boy, Willie, are wandering what has become of him. Mrs. Kennedy is hopeful that her husband will come home again. He left with an infantry battalion Pte. A. Kennedy.

INTRODUCTION

In the Summer of 2009 workmen conducting renovations in the Retail Lobby of the Vancouver Mail Processing Plant in Downtown Vancouver located a Memorial Plaque honouring Vancouver Post Office employees who were lost in World Wars I and II. The plaque was originally cast following WW I to honour eleven individuals then recast following WW II to honour three more. It was moved from its original location at the Vancouver Post Office, located at the time in what is now the Sinclair Centre on the North West corner of Granville and Hastings Streets, to the Main Lobby of the new building in 1958. Subsequent renovations to the Retail Lobby removed the Plaque from public view. In November 2010 the Van-Fraser Heritage Club hosted a ceremony, attended by representatives of the Canadian Armed Forces, to rededicate the Plaque and place it back in a prominent position in the newly renovated Retail Lobby.

As part of the Rededication Ceremony the Van-Fraser Heritage Club researched each of the names on the Plaque and prepared a history for each. This research led to the discovery of seven other Canada Post employees in British Columbia who were lost in World War I and 165 employees who served and safely returned.

The Vancouver Mail Processing ceased operations in 2014 and the Plaque has been relocated to the new processing facility in Richmond.

As the 100th Anniversary of the start of World War I is approaching Van-Fraser undertook research to locate as many Canada Post employees as possible who served in World War I. Our research included review of the data bases maintained by the Department of Veterans Affairs, web sites displaying City Directories of the time, as well as records maintained by local Archives. Also included in this compilation are some Postmasters from Semi-Staff and Revenue Offices and Rural Route service providers even though they were not employees. This research has resulted in the location of 1,764 Canada Post employees who served in World War I and of those 165 were lost. Also listed are nine women from Canada Post who volunteered to serve in England in Convalescent Homes for Wounded Soldiers.

Unfortunately this list cannot be considered as complete. Some records of the day are missing vital information and some are completely missing. Some individuals served in Militia Units that were not activated for service in the Canadian Expeditionary Force and their records are not available. These Militia Units performed a variety of duties in Canada such as guarding Military Bases and vital civilian facilities.

NOTES:

At the outbreak of World War I the Department of National Defense decided that rather than using existing Regimental names all Battalions and Units would be assigned numbers for identification. For example; the British Columbia Regiment became the 7th Battalion. Only the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, Royal Canadian Regiment and Lord Strathcona's Horse maintained their names. Where possible the traditional Regiment Name is listed following the Battalion Number. Since the end of World War I some of these Regiments have been disbanded or amalgamated with other Regiments.. Regimental Numbers are listed for non-commissioned soldiers. Officers were not assigned Regimental Numbers.

Individuals who died while in service or as a result of their service are highlighted in red, those wounded in blue and those captured as Prisoners of War in grey.

Medals and decorations, including campaign medals from previous service, are listed and shown for each individual.

Items of interest for individuals found in personnel records are including with the information.

Canadian Army Records are detailed but Royal Canadian Navy records do not contain a great deal of information.

In 1919 the Canadian and British Governments paid a War Service Gratuity to all who served in their respective including Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen and Nurses. As the British payment was lower than the Canadian payment the Canadian Government paid an Imperial War Service Gratuity to all Canadian residents who served in the British Forces and returned to Canada. Over 17,000 individuals applied for the payment

Over 60 per cent of British Army Records from World War I were destroyed in 1940 and information is limited.

TWO YEARS OF WAR: A VIEW FROM OTTAWA

In 1916 the Government of Canada issued a publication, *Two Years of War: A View From Ottawa*, that outlined the participation of Public Service Employees during the first two years of World War I. It provided a listing of Public Service employees who volunteered for Military Service up to November 1916.

The listing of Canada Post employees included those shown below but no indication of Military Service was located in Canada Post records or Canadian Military Records.. It is possible these individuals served only in Inactive Militia Units, been attached to Military Post Office Facilities in Canada or volunteered for Military Service and released as medically unfit.

THE WOMEN'S BRANCH

In January 1914 The Women's Branch, an Association of female Public Service employees, primarily in the Ottawa area came together largely through the efforts of Miss M. Tremblay of the Department of the Interior and several other enthusiastic supporters. The two primary goals were to promote an *esprit de corps* amongst its members and present the views of women pertaining to their role in the Public Service. The first executive of the organization included as President, Mary D. Doyle of the Post Office Department.

The Women's Branch primarily pursued these two goals until the outbreak of World War I in September 1914 when it directed its efforts to support the War Effort. Post Office Department employees made several significant contributions. Mary Doyle organized three committees; The Red Cross Committee; The City Relief Committee; a committee to organize the collection and distribution of an Emergency Fund. There was also a group of 89 Post Office female employees who prepared and mailed letters to returning injured soldiers offering them forms of assistance they may require.

The Women's Branch also organized Women's Voluntary Aid Detachment, consisting of 32 members, trained by the St. John's Ambulance Corps. These individuals volunteered a week or more to assist the Fleming Convalescent Home assisting with the treatment and rehabilitation of returned Wounded Soldiers. In 1916 a request came from England for personnel trained for this type of work. A number of members of the group volunteered to serve in England including the following Post Office employees.
