Report on Ship's Efficiency as an A/S Unit:-

General A/S efficiency very good. Morden's A/S team is above average. The A.S.C.O. is above average and has positive control of the A/S unit during operation and is very interested in A/S.

Commanding Officer is A/S conscious and is very keen and does a very efficient job during attacks. Junior officers are inexperienced and require to read C.B.'s pertaining to A/S.

Plot is well handled by Plotting Officer. H.S.D. takes pride in the set, good maintenance. S.D.'s are all keen and quite good operators and are able to hold a contact very well.

Remarks on Efficiency:

- (a) Main Armament.
 The supply party has proved a weak link but should improve with more drill. Guns and magazines well maintained.
- (b) Anti-aircraft Armament. Well maintained. A/A guns' crews keen and know how to handle their weapons.
- (c) Control.
 G.C.O. knows his spotting rules well but has a tendency of thinking he is much closer to target than really is and consequently gives orders contrary to the rules.
- (d) Magazines, (including flooding)
 Magazine and shell room clean and well stowed. Flooding tested weekly.

General Remarks on Ship's Gunnery:
The Q.R. II is not the least bit interested. Wishes to lose his gunnery rate and qualify Cox'n. This attitude is affecting the guns' crews. The Gunnery Control Officer doesn't help matters any by his surly and know-it-all attitude. In spite of these derogatory influences the ship is efficient in Gunnery.

Remarks on Efficiency:-

(a) V/S Department: Not as efficient as might be due to the Leading Sighalman not having enough initiative. Material is all good in this department, but needs shaking up. It is thought that Signal Officer will improve this when he gains experience.

(b) W/T Department:-

Fairly efficient, due to Leading Telegraphist being above average in intelligence and keenness. Takes charge well, procedure is rather weak but improvement in this was seen during WUP's.

(c) Coding:-

Fairly good. All must study and learn CONVOY ESCORT CODE, Alarm and Enemy Reports.

General Remarks on Ship's Communications:-

In some cases initiative displayed by the Leading Signalman was very good, but in other cases great lack of initiative was displayed.
e.g. Lack of attention to details, V/S repeating and procedure was weak. N.U.C. Lights and Balls, were being used, but it took too long to rig them. Batteries were not charged for aldis lamps, rendering After Signalling Position useless.

The Signal Officer of the ship has been in the ship almost three months and has recently taken over as the Signal Officer. He is trying hard, is interested and keen, but must take charge of his department.

Voice Pipe from outside Bridge to W/T Office (Effects fighting efficiency)

All minor war vessels recognition lights.

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SECTION V - ENGINE-ROOM.

Report of Ship's Efficiency in the Engine-Room Department:-

This department was in the process of being painted, and was found to be clean. Main and auxiliary machinery is stated to run well. It is noted that no E.R. rating was present in the Engine Room at time of inspection, although auxiliary machinery was running. It was also noted that the Rough Engine Room Register was not fully entered if steam was not on main engines. Attention of the C.E.R.A. was drawn to the above and also to lack of entries in \$338 Examination of Accessible compartments, and to lack of "Lectures for Guidance of E.O.'s".

C.E.R.A. Jennings had only been in the ship for two weeks, but should in time have an efficient department if regulations are correctly observed and carried out.

Reg. S.P.O. E. Hill, 21577, carries out his duties well.
