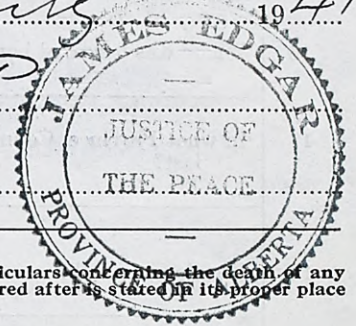

As his diploma shows that he is weak in Arithmetic, and until his name is reached on the Recruiting Roster, he should devote the interval in studying this subject as he will be examined on arrival at Esquimalt in simple sums and if not considered up to the educational standard required, he will not be entered.

Should your son's services be required the Department will communicate with you.

You should notify Naval Service Headquarters of any change of address.

Sir:-

I am directed to advise you that your son's application for entry in the Royal Canadian Navy is provisionally approved.

Your son is to proceed to R. C. N. Barracks, Esquimalt, for final educational and medical examination in time to arrive on the 4th of June, 1930.

Subject to his being found educationally and medically suitable he will be entered for service in the Royal Canadian Navy under the conditions already communicated to you.

He should present the enclosed Transportation Warrant to the Canadian National Railway Ticket Agent at Edmonton, who will give him in exchange a ticket for his transportation, from Edmonton to Esquimalt.

Upon arrival at R. C. N. Barracks the enclosed Route Order and Expense Sheet (in triplicate) should be handed to the Accountant Officer who will reimburse him for his living expenses during his journey at the rates payable in the Royal Canadian Navy.
